Drug-Impaired Driving in a New Age

According to NHTSA's national roadside surveys, the percentage of drivers with measurable alcohol levels declined by almost 30 percent between 2007 and 2014. However, during the same time frame, the percentage of drivers who tested positive for at least one other drug rose by 23 percent. Additionally, 1 in 10 high school seniors reported driving after smoking marijuana, increasing their risks of killing or seriously injuring themselves or others. How to address this growing problem? This workshop will explore innovative traffic safety countermeasures being successfully implemented to reduce drugged driving.

How the West was Won: Capitalizing on the Culture of Rural Communities to Improve Traffic Safety

Rural areas occupy 90 percent of the country and generally experience higher fatal and serious injury crash rates than their urban counterparts, with impaired driving and low seat belt usage often contributing to these poor outcomes. "I'm from the government and I'm here to help" does not go over well in many rural communities. So, what's a traffic safety advocate to do? 




