

 - Fatigue



WHAT IS OPERATION GHOST RIDER?

- A new distracted driving enforcement initiative designed to save lives and prevent injuries.
- Announced at a press conference in Macomb County, Michigan on April 25, 2017.
 - Education
 - Enforcement



- Uses an unmarked spotter vehicle, which contains a law enforcement passenger.
- When the spotter observes a distracted driver, they radio a fully marked law enforcement unit to initiate a traffic stop.









PLANNING

- Get buy-in from law enforcement agencies
- Determine the location(s), date(s), and times of enforcement
 - Based on responses from the participating law enforcement agencies and other factors
- Designate a group radio channel for multiple law enforcement agencies to communicate
- Create an enforcement schedule
 - Primary contact information
 - Briefing time and location
 - Enforcement dates, times, and agencies



- Plan a press conference to be held on the kickoff date
- Create a news release
 - Release a few days prior to the first enforcement wave to educate the public
- Share the enforcement mobilization on social media

ENFORCEMENT KICKOFF

- Agency briefing at a designated time and location
- Host the press conference
 - Traffic safety leaders
 - Law enforcement
 - Victims
- Enforcement
 - Provide ride-along opportunities for the news media to held spread the message





FOLLOW-UP

- Collect the enforcement results from the participating law enforcement agencies
- Share the results with the law enforcement agencies and news media
- Determine if any challenges were present and how they can be resolved



TEXTING LAW

- Many distracted drivers were observed committing other offenses (i.e. red-light running, speeding, etc.).
- Since Michigan's texting law is often challenged in court, many violators were written for other violations.


WE MUST BE PROACTIVE AND PREVENT TRAFFIC CRASHES FROM OCCURRING
