KEY FINDINGS

Grant Administration & Oversight

- Collaboration with traffic safety partners was helped NHTSA to quickly pivot and continue to conduct normal operations in order to support the Agency's mission
- NHTSA is continuing to evaluate processes that may require a more permanent change or shift

KEY FINDINGS

2020 First Quarter (Jan – Mar) Fatality Projections

- 70 fewer lives lost in 2020 Q1 (7,780) as compared to 2019 Q1 (7,850)
 - a 0.9 percent decline
- •FHWA reported VMT declined by 40.1 billion miles about a 5.4 percent decline during 2020 Q1 as compared to 2019 Q1
- Fatality Rate per 100 Million VMT increased to 1.10 during 2020 Q1 from 1.05 in 2019 Q1
