District 5 is located in central Wyoming and includes residents of Fremont County and the Wind River Indian Reservation.


WYDOT advocates for positive messaging within a community-based model as a means of changing behavior, including:

Wind River Indian Reservation







Figure 8: Wind River Reservation, WY and Area Age by Generation

Campaign Development

Since 2009, WYDOT has partnered with Denver-based Heinrich Marketing, to create culturally, and in some cases linguistically, relevant messaging to address tribal traffic safety issues.

Cultural identity is a critical component of effective behavior change message development.

Messaging and Outreach

- Creative strategy
 - Featuring respected community members young and old — ensures maximum message relevance.
- Language
 - Many native languages are dying, so keeping words "alive" is important.
- Identification, and proper use, of icons
 - Values
 - Customs
 - Symbols
 - Regalia










Tribal > general market crossover

ENFORCEMENT

Between 2012 and 2020...

- A total of 120 people died on Fremont County* roadways:
 - 73 were unrestrained
 - 70 died in alcohol and drug related crashes




*population: 39,261

 - Shoshoni PD




- High visibility enforcement effort was conducted over Labor Day weekend, including all local law enforcement agencies.
- 393 total traffic stops during HVE period:
 - Seatbelt 52
 - Child restraint 18
 - Speed Citations 88
 - Other Citations 87
 - DUI 11
 - 4 alcohol
 - 2 drug
 - 5 combined
 - Drug Arrests 9
 - Warning Issued 259
 - Other Arrests 13



ENGINEERING


- 1. Rebuilding 17 Mile Road, the old highway between St. Stephens and Hudson (now called Rendezvous Road).
- Rebuilding Wyoming 132 (Blue Sky Highway) between Ethete and Lander.
- 3. Building a pedestrian pathway from Ethete, past Wyoming Indian High School, to Wyoming Indian Elementary School.



WY132 highway improvement > \$14.63 million project.



\$1.14 million bank rehabilitation project, west of Riverton at the 500-foot-long U.S. 26 bridge.



Impaired driving, and seat belt usage, is being actively discussed.

Improvements in the tribal law-and-order code have reflected, and reinforced, this behavior-based approach.

Tribal ownership has been a positive outcome of these efforts — the Reservation has new laws and enhanced BIA enforcement efforts.

Focused attention on road and bridge improvements.
