

APHA ICEHS Presidents' Road Safety Scholarship Fund 2023

The Injury Control and Emergency Health Services (ICEHS) Presidents' Road Safety Scholarship Fund is supported by leaders of national and international traffic safety organizations to help our student and early career professional members attend the American Public Health Association annual meeting. Through this fund, the ICEHS section provides awards of up to \$500 to help offset the cost of registration and/or travel for the 2023 meeting in Atlanta, GA, November 12-15.

You must be a Student member or Early Career Professional member of APHA to apply. This support is intended for members of the ICEHS section. However, those who currently belong to another section of APHA may also join ICEHS to be eligible to apply. *Preference is given to applicants who are pursuing road safety topics.*
